Hello Donna,

There is a lot of misinformation about TAP. First of all, the truth is that TAP is not funded and will not be funded. We have another program, ASP, which is funded. But neither TAP nor ASP have anything to do with spraying.

Our environmental research simply takes samples of air to analyze to try to understand the links between aerosol particles (pollution) and air quality, climate change, and human health. We don't do any spraying or injecting.
